

Summary:

The event began with an initial address delivered by the Head of the Department, Dr. Shayeari Dutta, followed by the inaugural address by the Principal of Surendranath College, Dr. Indranil Kar.

The keynote address on the first day of the conference was delivered by Titas De Sarkar. His talk brilliantly addressed the nuances of the notion of friendship as a response to the experiences of slavery. The first technical session on the first day was chaired by Dr. Pinky Isha, Assistant Professor, Rabindra Bharati University. The papers in the first technical session engaged with the negotiations of slavery in the Afro-American, Diasporic and South Asian experiences of slavery. The second technical session was chaired by Dr. Shoaib Ekram, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Rabindra Bharati University. The discussion in the second technical session offered an insight into the cultural specificities of hierarchy and slavery, the minority discourse in the post-colonial nation states, the regimes of domestic slavery colonial Calcutta and so on.

The most insightful first plenary talk was delivered by Dr. Swati Moitra, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Gurudas College, Kolkata. The second plenary talk was delivered by the esteemed Professor, Dr. Ini Uko, Professor, Department of English, University of Uyo, Nigeria. Professor Uko's very well researched and insightful talk offered a fresh perspective on the status of slavery of black women within the conceptual parameters of enslavement.
